

**PRTF as it relates to substance abuse services information**

Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities (PRTFs) provide active treatment in a structured therapeutic environment for children and youth with significant functional impairments resulting from an identified mental health diagnosis with or without a co-occurring disorder. The PRTFs began serving the youth of Kansas officially July 1, 2007 – with 16 facilities and 523 beds.

**A few important things to understand –**

1. Substance abuse services are required to be provided if they are medically necessary, however, the PRTF may choose to provide these services directly by having a program that is certified by Addiction and Prevention Services (AAPS), or by referring out to an AAPS licensed/certified provider.
2. PRTF's receive an all inclusive daily rate (based on 5 cost centers – one specific to treatment services) with the exception of medical services and pharmaceuticals, all other service is included in this daily rate
  - a. If a child in this level of care needs a substance abuse service and the PRTF does not provide it, the PRTF must contract with and pay out of their daily rate, a licensed/certified substance abuse provider to provide this service.

**PIHP Assignment –**

1. Level of care is a factor in determining Medicaid eligibility. When a child is admitted into a PRTF, their level of care changes to assignment in “Group 3”. This can be seen in KMAP as “PRTF level of care”. **This means they are no longer eligible for services reimbursed by the Substance Abuse Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP).** When a child discharges from a PRTF, their level of care changes. PIHP Assignment returns to “Group 1 or 2” and they become eligible for services reimbursed by the PIHP, **but not until the first of the month following the discharge from the PRTF and completion of the MS-2126 form.** This is not an automated process. These changes occur only when staff in local SRS offices enters the MS-2126 form which the PRTF sends to them upon discharge.
2. Below is a list as of 6.2.09 of these SRS staff in each area that has a PRTF. **We encourage providers to develop relationships with these staff in order to facilitate a smooth level of care change.**
3. When a child discharges from a PRTF, the MS-2126 is what triggers the change from assignment in “Group 3” back to “Group 1 or 2”; however **this change does not take effect until the first of the month following the discharge and submission of MS-2126.** Until the time that the KMAP website shows this level of care change and return to PIHP assignment, Level 1, Level 2, and assessment substance abuse services are reimbursable by Medicaid Fee-For-Service via EDS. Level 3 substance abuse services are reimbursable by AAPS funds when financial and other eligibility requirements are met. There is no opportunity for Medicaid reimbursement for Level 3 services until the KMAP website shows PIHP assignment. If the client needs Level 3 services but has not been PIHP assigned, AAPS funding may be used if the provider is an AAPS funded provider and the client meets all eligibility requirements.

If the member has substance abuse service needs, as part of discharge planning complete the KCPC to determine what level of care they may need as follow up to PRTF substance abuse services.

**Substance Abuse Services to Members Post PRTF Discharge:**

1. Mark the KCPC funding source as Medicaid.
2. Include PRTF status (including discharge date) in your note, when you are completing the KCPC.
3. ValueOptions-Kansas will process this KCPC and make an authorization decision based on medical necessity. It is important to understand that, regardless of authorization status, VO-KS can only pay for services for members who are assigned to them, as evidenced by KMAP website verification.
4. The KCPC system does not allow Level 1 or 2 vouchers to be added more than one day in advance. Therefore, if you need an authorization number and it is more than one day prior to the intake day, please submit the KCPC without a voucher. VO-KS will add the voucher after the Release of Information is received from the Level 1 or 2 treatment provider.
5. The KCPC system does not allow a Level 3 voucher to be added in the future. Therefore, if you need an authorization number to hold a bed, please submit the KCPC without the voucher attached. VO-KS will make a

medical necessity determination and return the KCPC with the authorization number. VO-KS will add the voucher after the R.O.I. is received from the Level 3 treatment provider.

6. If you are contacted to complete a KCPC assessment for a member prior to discharge from the PRTF, please make some arrangements with the PRTF in terms of how to handle payment before you schedule the assessment. This is important since the PRTF is already receiving payment for all treatment services and VO-KS will not be able to reimburse you for an assessment that is completed while a member resides in a PRTF.
